### 3C. JUDGMENTS AND/OR PROFESSIONAL MALPRACTICE

BRS has managed more than 200 federal cooperative agreements and secured numerous state, local, and foundation grants for clients totaling over \$616.3 million, and has not been cited for deficiencies or non-compliance by any regulatory or funding agency. All associated audits have had no major adverse audit findings. This includes grant awards from the US Economic Development Administration; US Environmental Protection Agency; the US Department of Transportation; the US Department of Housing and Urban Development; and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection. ### 3D. PROPOSAL NARRATIVE: UNDERSTANDING OF AND APPROACH TO SCOPE OF SERVICES

In 2018, on behalf of the City, BRS completed a Preliminary Assessment Report (PAR) / ASTM Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for the Site dated May 24, 2018. During prior Preliminary Assessment (PA) and 2022 Site Investigation (SI) activities, an out-of-service underground storage tank (UST), along with several other metallic anomalies, were identified. Test pit investigations confirmed the presence of the UST, and soil and groundwater testing confirmed heating oil impacts above NJ standards.

Five (5) AOCs/RECs were identified for the site.

- AOC/REC-1: 550-gallon UST – 63 Ridge - SI activities conducted in 2005 at 63 Ridge Avenue identified a leaking UST within 63 Ridge Avenue, along with associated contamination to soil and groundwater, under NJDEP Case No. 05-07-28-1722-18. While this was identified as a heating oil UST, benzene, ethylbenzene, xylenes, and methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) were detected in a groundwater sample collected adjacent to the leaking UST. Benzene was detected at a concentration of 2.3 µg/l in a groundwater sample collected adjacent to the leaking UST (AOC/REC-1). This concentration exceeds the GWQS for benzene of 1 µg/l. These contaminants are typically associated with gasoline releases. In addition, high concentrations of total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) in soil were reported surrounding the UST to the north, south, east, and west with TPH concentrations reported between 12,000 and 26,000 mg/kg.
- AOC/REC-2: Reported UST Release – 61 Ridge - Monmouth County's UGST Database included a reported leaking UST on 61 Ridge Avenue, under NJDEP Case No. 05-11-02-0141-30. No other evidence of a leaking UST on 61 Ridge was identified, either in prior reports or NJDEP records.



- AOC/REC-3: Motor Fluids -Two vehicles were observed on the property in disrepair with potential motor fluid releases.
- AOC/REC-4: Broken Metal Pipe - During a 2005 site inspection, a broken metal pipe was reportedly observed on the southern end of the site.
- AOC/REC-5: Metallic Anomalies - During a 2005 geophysical investigation, several metallic anomalies were reportedly encountered along the northern boundary of the site.

Per the Site Investigation Report, March 2023, no further action is necessary for AOCs 2-5. Historic Fill was encountered in all soil borings installed during the 2022 investigation and was added as AOC-6. Historic fill will require remediation.

Groundwater was sampled as part of the 2022 site investigation activities. Five temporary wells were installed on October 21, 2022 to confirm historical contamination and determine current concentrations. Petroleum odors were observed in the soil borings associated with four of the five temporary wells and elevated PID readings greater than 30 ppm were observed in the three temporary wells surrounding the UST. Benzene was found to exceed the NJDEP Groundwater Quality Standards (GWQS) in two temporary wells (TW-1 and TW-2) located north of and adjacent to the reported leaking UST at the northwest corner of 63 Ridge Avenue (AOC-1: 550-gallon UST).

No parameters were identified in groundwater above the NJDEP Groundwater Screening Levels (GWSLs) for vapor intrusion during the 2022 site investigation activities. As such, no vapor intrusion investigation is warranted at this time. An Initial Receptor Evaluation was completed as part of the SI.

In order to close the data gaps from previous investigations, additional investigation is required for impacts associated with AOC-1. Additional investigation is required to determine the northern extent of the soil and groundwater contamination and to explore the potential of off-site sources (former service stations) impacting the subject property. Based on a review of historical fire insurance Sanborn maps, the property north and adjacent to the subject property was formerly occupied by a service station. As such, the potential for off-site petroleum impacts to the subject property exists. As a result, the recommended activities are described below.

### SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work includes completion of:

- Task 1: Remedial Investigation Preparation Activities
- Task 2: Soil Investigation
- Task 3: Monitoring Well Installation, Sampling & Survey
- Task 4: Data Management and Evaluation
- Task 5: Receptor Evaluation and Remedial Investigation Report

The services described below include labor, materials, expendables, and subcontractors necessary to complete the work in accordance with applicable laws and regulations, to include the New Jersey



Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Technical Requirements for Site Remediation (Tech Regs).

BRS shall provide regular updates and progress reports to the City throughout the project. Progress reports will accompany each invoice. Upon the City's request, BRS may provide status summaries, including preliminary analytical results, prior to the completion of the scope of work.

### **Task 1: Remedial Investigation Preparation Activities**

Activities to take place prior to mobilization to the site include the following:

- *LSRP Retention* – Since exceedances of regulatory standards has been reported for the site, it is necessary to retain an LSRP for oversight of the project. BRS LSRP, Alena Buhler, is currently retained under PI# 285480. This proposal does not include the payment of any NJDEP fees on behalf of the client.
- *Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP); Health and Safety Plan (HASP)* - BRS has prepared an existing Health and Safety Plan (HASP) and EPA-approved Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) for this site. A review of the existing documents will be made and any necessary changes to those documents will be completed.
- *Public Notification* – In accordance with the notification and outreach requirements of N.J.A.C. 7:26C-1.7, BRS has posted a sign at the property indicating that the site is currently under environmental investigation.

### **Task 2: Soil Investigation**

BRS shall conduct its work at the Site in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 7:26E. This work will be directed by a NJ LSRP. It is anticipated that up to eight borings will be advanced around the UST to depths sufficient to delineate the vertical and horizontal extent of soil contamination associated with the release, and that the depth of each boring will be no greater than 15 feet. Two soil samples will be collected from each boring: one sample at the evidence of highest contamination, and one sample below the impacted sample at an assumed clean interval. In an effort to document that the historic fill material is not contaminated, a minimum of two samples will be collected from the historic fill layer.

Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) samples including one Duplicate, one Field Blank (FB), one Matrix spike (MS) and one Matrix Spike Duplicate (MSD) will also be collected.

Historic fill layer samples will be analyzed for Polynuclear Aromatic Hydrocarbons (PAHs) and EPA Target Analyte List (TAL) metals, with one sample analyzed for the complete EPA Target Compound List (TCL) /TAL analysis and Extractable Petroleum Hydrocarbons (EPH) using EPH Category 2. Soil samples collected from the UST area will be analyzed for Category 1 and 2 EPH with 25 percent of samples with EPH detections additionally analyzed for Volatile Organic Compounds with a search for Tentatively Identified Compounds (VOC+TICs), Semi-Volatile Organic Compounds with a search for TICs (SVOC+TICs), Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs), and Target Analyte List (TAL) metals.



**Task 3: Monitoring Well Installation, Sampling & Survey**

It is anticipated that up to five permitted monitoring wells will be installed in the area of the UST to allow for delineation and continued groundwater monitoring. It is assumed that all five monitoring wells will be installed to fifteen feet bgs, and constructed of two-inch diameter Schedule 40 PVC piping with a five-foot slotted screen. The monitoring wells will be installed by a licensed driller in accordance with New Jersey's Well Construction and Maintenance requirements, N.J.A.C. 7:9D. Once installed, the monitoring wells will be surveyed by a licensed surveyor so that groundwater elevation and flow direction can be determined. Each well will have a maximum of eight rounds of quarterly sampling conducted for some or all of the VOC+TICs, SVOC+TICs, TAL Metals, tertiary butyl alcohol (TBA), and 1,2-dibromoethane (EDB), as applicable. QA/QC samples including one Duplicate, one MS, one MSD, one FB and one Trip Blank (TB) will also be collected.

All Investigation Derived Waste (IDW) generated during the RI, including but not limited to decontamination water, purge water and soil cuttings, shall be contained, characterized and transported to a licensed facility for off-site disposal. For the purpose of generating a cost estimate, it is assumed that one waste characterization sample of purge/decontamination water and one waste characterization sample of soil cuttings will be collected for analysis of TCL/TAL+30. It is assumed that disposal of eleven, 55-gallon drums containing non-hazardous IDW will be required. It is also assumed that, following completion of the fieldwork, drums may be temporarily stored on site until collection is scheduled. It is assumed that one pick-up will be required to collect all drums for off-site disposal.

**Task 4: Data Management and Evaluation**

All data collected during the RI will be used to prepare boring logs, figures and tables. Results will be evaluated and compared to the applicable NJDEP standards to determine if the RI is complete. The data will be validated and its usability assessed to ensure that data quality objectives are met. Electronic data deliverables (EDDs) will also need to be prepared and submitted to the NJDEP, as required.

**Task 5: NJDEP Regulatory Reporting**

The work performed for the RI including all analytical data will be reported to the NJDEP in a Remediation Investigation/Remedial Action Work Plan (RI/RAWP) Report that will be certified by the LSRP of record for the site. The report will include a summary of the completed investigation activities, a technical overview of the site, an assessment of data usability, findings and conclusions, as well as a work plan to remediate the identified contamination associated with AOC/REC- 1 and 6. The reporting will include the preparation and submission of a Case Inventory Document (CID), a Receptor Evaluation (RE) and a Classification Exception Area (CEA) Fact Sheet Form, as may be applicable, which will require fate and transport modeling. The RI/RAWP Report will be provided to the City in draft and final form. The final report will be submitted to the NJDEP through their on-line portal.

**SCHEDULE**

BRS will begin immediately upon notice to proceed. It's anticipated that the QAPP associated with the sample collection and analysis will not need to be submitted to EPA given the anticipated funding source.



Assuming no delays are encountered due to site access or EPA review, we anticipate completing the tasks as follows:

Within two weeks of receiving City comments, the report will be finalized and resubmitted to the City and other stakeholders as applicable, prior to submitting to NJDEP.

**COST ESTIMATE**

The total cost is estimated to be **\$160,112**. The billing rate schedule and detailed cost proposal for this project is included in Section 4. Please note that the provided price form does not fully comport with the scope of work set forth in the April 21, 2025 Request for Qualifications. As such, the cost estimate we have provided is augmented so that Asbury Park can more effectively manage the funding source requirements and the implementation of the requisite assessment work needed to advance the project.

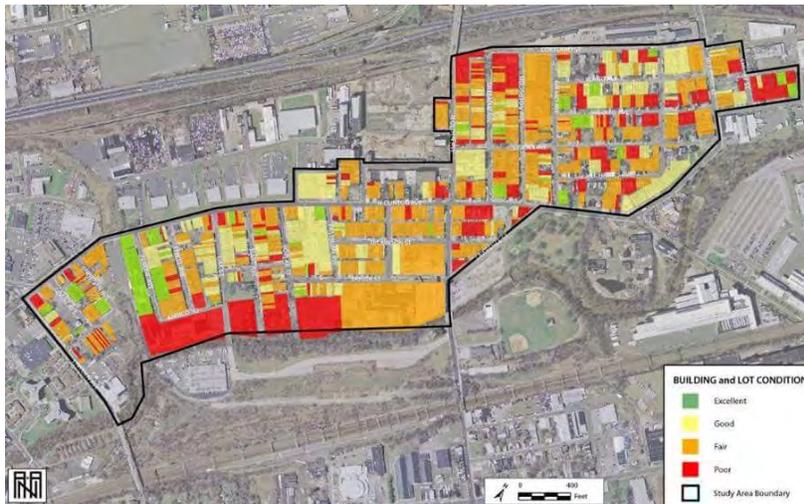

**City of Trenton, NJ - Assunpink Creek Greenway (2003– Present)**



The Assunpink Greenway is an expansive, 99-acre linear park project adjacent to the Assunpink Creek, running through an impoverished section of Trenton.

The project area includes former industrial properties held by public and private owners. Transforming this large, contaminated, flood-prone area into a greenway is a long-term and ambitious task.

BRS obtained all funding for and manages the entire project, including:

- Over \$5 million in U.S. Economic Development Administration grant funding, \$1.6 million in U.S. Environmental Protection Agency grants, and approximately \$10 million in NJ Department of Environmental Protection Agency grants
- Oversight of subcontractors and area environmental assessment activities, including the former railroad maintenance yard abutting Amtrak’s Northeast Corridor line.

**Pattern Machine and Foundry (2018 - Present)**

Located in an economically and socially disadvantaged Trenton neighborhood that contains older housing stock, the environmentally contaminated site was adjacent to residential areas and a city playground and park. By combining this century old defunct industrial facility with adjacent parcels, new residential housing developments are able to be built.



**BRS's Role:**

- Prepared EPA- and state-funded Preliminary Assessment Report (Phase I) and Site Investigation Work Plan (Phase II)

BRS has **prepared and assisted with the implementation of over \$37.4 million in State and EPA funding** including EPA Brownfield Assessment, Cleanup, Revolving Loan Fund, and RLF Supplemental Grants, along with an Area Wide Planning Grant, for a total of over \$16.5 million in EPA funding. BRS has used these EPA funding awards to leverage over \$20.9 million in additional state awards to create **urban parks, housing developments, and light industrial development areas**. ### ***Camden Labs Site Redevelopment for Whitman Park Improvements Project (2014 - 2020)***

The former headquarters of Camden Laboratories, a medical biotech facility in Camden, NJ, was abandoned in 2008 and demolished in 2018. The 3.5-acre site then became a prominent location for illegal dumping activity. A unique partnership called the Camden Collaborative Initiative helped put an end to these activities by leveraging the combined work of Camden County Metro Police, Camden Department of Public Works, NJ Department of Environmental Protection, and other stakeholder partners to secure and put cameras at the site. Once the site was stabilized, the Camden Redevelopment Agency (CRA) was able to begin taking steps to redevelop the site as an expansion area for the city-owned Whitman Park recreational facilities. Preparations for the site involved the safe removal and disposal of impacted soil, asphalt driveway extraction, grading, topsoil additions, and utility improvements.

The environmental investigation, remediation, and demolition of seven dilapidated buildings were made possible by \$2.1 million in funding from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and \$750,000 from the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The expansion of Whitman Park into the former Camden Labs site nearly doubles the size of the park, and renovations to the park reflect direct involvement in the design process by the community, through meetings with sports league coaches, neighboring schools, and attendees at community outreach events. The park improvements include new and refurbished athletics fields and facilities, a public-use playground area, a covered pavilion, concession stands, water spray stations, additional seating, and lighting.

In addition to expanding and improving an important gathering space for the neighborhood, the Camden Labs site redevelopment served as a catalyst for further revitalization efforts, with BRS continuing to support the CRA in the preparation of a successful EPA Area-Wide Planning Grant application and the resulting planning efforts to address brownfield redevelopment opportunities across the Mount Ephraim neighborhood.

- Performed EPA grant management services to include fulfillment of all cooperative agreement reporting requirements and all requisite drawdown activities

**ABC Barrel Site: Licensed Site Remediation Professional Assessment and Remediation Management (2011 - Present)**

Abandoned for over 30 decades, BRS was instrumental in procuring the remediation funding needed for this small, high-impact site within the City of Camden's most income diverse residential neighborhood. Anchored by a branch campus of Rutgers University on one end and waterfront views of Philadelphia on the other, the Cooper Grant neighborhood is in high demand for additional residential development, yet this property sat idle for want of cleanup money for the public agency tasked with redeveloping it. Remediation fieldwork was completed in spring 2017. Once redevelopment is completed, the site will provide additional housing options in the neighborhoods as well as a public open space park.

**BRS's Role:**

- Developed strategy to address environmental assessment, remediation, and funding needs
- Assisted with securing over \$1 million in EPA funding and over \$500,000 in state funding for the project over a period of several years
- Prepared the remediation bid specification

**Cramer Hill Waterfront Park at the Former Harrison Avenue Landfill (2004 - Present)**

Situated on a former unregulated city dump that accepted municipal and industrial wastes from circa 1950s to 1971, the 86-acre former Harrison Avenue Landfill site was acquired by the Camden Redevelopment Agency (CRA), who was working with a private developer to turn the site and surrounding area into a gated residential community and golf course on the Delaware River. As the surrounding disadvantaged community became very vocal in their opposition and the project eventually failed, BRS was retained in 2004 and assisted the CRA in their efforts to redirect the project, procuring funding and serving as outsourced staff responsible for grant administration and project management support.



This former landfill now hosts The Salvation Army’s Joan and Ray Kroc Center, a vibrant community center with ball fields, aquatics center, day care, and medical clinic, and the Cramer Hill Waterfront Park, which opened to the public in November 2021, and offers a wealth of public resources including an amphitheater, fishing plaza, hiking/biking paths and trails, historic/educational signage, a kayak launch, picnic area, playground, sensory garden, shoreline observation areas, and a summit vista with panoramic views of the Delaware River, Petty’s Island, the Benjamin Franklin Bridge, and Philadelphia, PA.

In addition to the landfill closure and park construction, the project involved the restoration and creation of approximately seven acres of freshwater tidal wetlands; over 3,000 feet of bioengineered vegetative shoreline, including 450 feet of living shoreline in three areas along the back channel of the Delaware River; habitats for wildlife including endangered species; over 375,000 plantings; and a two-acre tidally fed fishing pond. The habitat restoration was constructed by NJDEP with coordination support from BRS.

BRS’s continuing role as Owner’s Representative involves procuring and overseeing various consultants and contractors for the environmental assessment, Title V air permitting, and remediation closeout efforts at the site; developing an O&M Manual for the long term maintenance of the ecological and remediation systems at the site; providing technical reviews and input regarding the various operating and construction agreements for the site; serving as a liaison between the public sector owner and the state and federal regulatory agencies; and community outreach for the remediation efforts at the site.

The CRA received both the 2015 and 2022 Region 2 Phoenix Awards from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the Kroc Center and Waterfront Park redevelopments, respectively.

**Success factors included:**

- Involving the existing community in a meaningful way, and having a willingness and ability to change plans based on that input
- Obtaining, coordinating, and fulfilling the requirements of successive rounds of public sector grants from a variety of federal, state, and local funding sources, for



- over \$10 million toward investigation, remediation, and redevelopment
- Partnering with the state regulatory agency (NJDEP) for their creative use of state natural resource damage claim settlement funding
  - Working in partnership with the various visions in NJDEP and EPA to make the project a reality
  - Oversaw grant management activities for multiple state and federal funding sources

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation or sex.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer, advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq., as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to employ minority and women workers consistent with the applicable county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2 or a binding determination of the applicable county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.

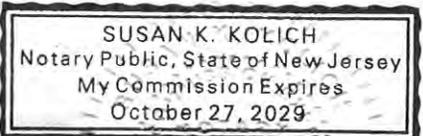

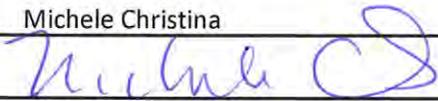

This Service Agreement (“Agreement”) is effective as of this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 2025, by and between the **City of Asbury Park, New Jersey (“City”)**, a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey, having an address at **One Municipal Plaza, Asbury Park, New Jersey 07712)** and **Brownfield Redevelopment Solutions, Inc (“BRS”)** having an address at 739 Stokes Road Units A&B Medford, NJ 08055, each being a “Party”, and together are hereby referred to as the “Parties” to this Agreement.

**WHEREAS**, the City has a need for conducting a Remedial Investigation environmental assessment services; and

**WHEREAS**; the City evaluated the qualifications proposal submitted by BRS to provide the necessary environmental services to the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council authorized by Resolution 2025-XXX the City to enter into a professional services agreement with BRS;

**WHEREAS**, the anticipated term of this contract is for one year, to expire one (1) year from the date of execution;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and obligations, and agreements made and contained herein, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Scope of Services

BRS will be responsible for services outlined in “**Proposed Scope of Work**” section of Brownfield Redevelopment Solutions, Inc. “ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES” dated May 14, 2025, which is incorporated hereto as Attachment A; and Resolution 2025-XXX entitled “Resolution **INSERT RESOLUTION TITLE**”, which is incorporated hereto as Attachment B.

2. Payment Schedule and Compensation

Total compensation will not exceed **INSERT XXXXXX** Dollars (\$**XXXXXX**) (“Contract Amount.”).

All fees will be paid based upon the fee schedule outlined in BRS’ proposal incorporated into Attachment A.

### 3. Non-Disclosure of Analysis

The City has right of ownership and dissemination of all data and other information derived from work performed in conjunction with this Agreement.

Except upon written approval of the City or otherwise stipulated herein, BRS shall not furnish or disclose to any person or organization, including but not limited to (1) any report, study, data or other information provided by or obtained from, the City in connection with this Agreement; (2) any grant application, reports, studies, recommendations, data or information relating to or made or developed in the course of the performance of this agreement; or (3) the results of the performance of any grant application, investigation and/or analysis except as may be required by law.

### 4. Compliance With Laws

BRS shall observe and comply will all state, local, federal laws, and the rules of any governing body having jurisdiction over the premises and/or its use.

### 5. Liability Insurance

BRS shall carry and maintain in full force and effect for the duration of this Professional Service Agreement and any supplement thereto the insurance coverages set forth below:

- A. Worker's Compensations and Employers Liability in accordance with State of New Jersey requirements, with a minimum limit of:
  - a. \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury by accident
  - b. \$1,000,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease
  - c. \$1,000,000 policy limit for bodily injury by disease
  
- B. Public Liability Insurance: Comprehensive General Liability, (bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage liability) including company's contingent Completed operations and contractual liability with a minimum:
  - a. \$1,000,000 each occurrence
  - b. \$1,000,000 personal and advertising injury
  - c. \$2,000,000 general aggregate; and
  - d. \$1,000,000 products/completed operations aggregate
  
- C. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance. Covering all owned, hired and rented vehicles and equipment, with limits of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 for injuries to, or death of one or more persons resulting from any one occurrence and property damage limit of liability of not less than \$500,000 per occurrence.

All insurance certificates will name the City as an additional insured on the policy. Said Certificate must state that coverage cannot be cancelled or materially altered without thirty (30) days written notice to the City.

#### 6. Indemnification and Allocation of Risk

BRS agrees to indemnify, save and hold harmless the City, its commissioners, directors, officers, employees, representatives or agents against any and all demands, claims, suits, losses, costs or direct damages to the extent caused by the negligent acts, omissions or misconduct of BRS, its officers, agents, employees and subcontractors in the performance of work by BRS under this Services Agreement.

#### 7. Term of Agreement

The term of this Agreement shall be for a one year period from the date of execution.

#### 8. Termination

##### A. Termination for Default

BRS' performance and fulfillment of its obligations under this Service Agreement shall be regularly evaluated by the City. If the City in their sole discretion determines that BRS has not met its obligations hereunder, the City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement upon giving not less than ten (10) days written notice to BRS. In the event that the City exercises their right to terminate the Agreement, BRS shall be entitled to payment for all work completed in accordance with the requirements of this Agreement up to and including the effective date of termination of this Agreement. Additionally, BRS shall also be entitled to payment for all non-cancelable commitments to third parties with respect to the scheduling and performance of the work tasks under the Scope of Work. In the event of termination pursuant to this Paragraph, the City shall be without further liability to BRS under this Agreement. Except as to the payments provided herein, BRS understands and agrees that it is not entitled to any damages whatsoever in the event of termination of this Agreement.

##### B. Termination for Convenience

Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 8(a), BRS and the City hereby reserve the right to terminate this Service Agreement at any time, for any reason whatsoever, upon giving not less than twenty (20) days written notice to the other party. Both BRS and the City understand and agree that the other party is not entitled to any damages whatsoever in the event of termination of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event that the Agreement is terminated pursuant to this Paragraph, BRS shall be entitled to payment for all work completed in accordance with the requirements of this Agreement up to and including the effective date of the termination. Additionally, BRS shall also be entitled to payment for all non-cancelable commitments to third parties with respect to the scheduling and performance of work tasks under the Scope of Services.

## 9. The Service Agreement

This Service Agreement, and all other documents referred to herein and/or attached hereto, constitute the entire Agreement of the Parties on the subject matter hereof and supersede any and all prior representations, understandings, and agreements between the Parties with respect to such subject matter. The documents referred to herein and attached hereto shall be read together with this agreement to determine the Parties intent. If there is a conflict between and among such documents, this Agreement shall be the final expression of the Parties' intent. Any Amendment to this agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties or it is void.

## 10. Political Contribution Disclosure

The within Agreement has been awarded to the Contractor based upon the merits and abilities of the Contractor to provide the services as described herein. This Agreement was not awarded through a "fair and open process" pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4, et seq. As such, the undersigned do hereby attest that the Contractor, his/her firm, his/her firm's subsidiaries and assigns, and any principals controlling in excess of ten percent (10%) of his / her firm, have neither made a contribution that is reportable pursuant to the Election Law Enforcement Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-8 or 19:44A-16, in the one(1) year period preceding the award of the Agreement that would, pursuant to P.L. 2004, c. 19, affect the Contractor's eligibility to perform this Agreement, nor will the Contractor or his/her firm make a reportable contribution during the term of the within Agreement to any political party committee in the City of Asbury Park if a member of that political party is serving in an elective public office of the City of Asbury Park when the agreement is awarded, or to any candidate committee of any person serving in an elective public office of the City of Asbury Park when the Agreement is awarded.

The Engineer's Estimate was prepared using unit prices generally based on the New Jersey Department of Transportation Bid Price Report 2023 and on historical bids for other similar projects within the City. Our final Engineer's Estimate was \$532,617.00.

The low bid is 18.6% lower than the Engineer's Estimate. The high bid is 3.6% lower than the Engineer's Estimate. The average of the bids received is \$473,194.10. The range between the high and low bids is \$79,860.91.

The unit price information contained within these bids will be utilized to refine our future Engineer's Estimates for projects of similar scope and scale.

  - There is an error in the extended price tabulation for Contract Item No.61 – Straw Mulching. The extended price tabulation for Contract Item No. 61 should have been \$500.00 as opposed to \$50.00, which was submitted. Therefore, based on the Contractor's proposed unit prices, the Total Bid Amount should have been \$433,263.65 as opposed to \$432,813.65 which was submitted.

Note: The above referenced bid tabulation error does not impact the result of the lowest bidder.

### **Summary and Recommendation**

Based on the analysis of the bids received, J.C. Contracting, Inc. is the lowest bidder. As such, we recommend that the City consider them for the award of this construction contract.

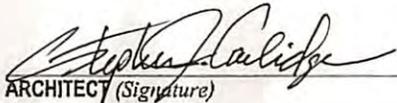
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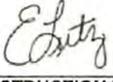

**THIS AGREEMENT**, entered into on this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2025, by and between The City of ASBURY PARK, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as the “City”), and JOHN B. HAYES (hereinafter referred to as the “Police Director” or “Director”), hereby establishes the following terms and conditions of employment for the position of Police Director. This agreement represents the complete and final understanding on all bargaining issues between the City and the Police Director.

**ARTICLE I**  
**APPOINTMENT OF THE POLICE DIRECTOR**

The Director, having been appointed by the City Manager, shall be an “at will” employee of the City of Asbury Park. Pursuant to State Law N.J.S.A. 40A:14-118, the Ordinances of the City and the regulations and policies established by the City, the Director of Police shall be designated as the “Appropriate Authority” of the Police Department. Furthermore, he shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Police Department, hereinafter referred to as the “Department”. His authority, rights, duties and responsibilities as set forth in the Code of the City of Asbury Park are, listed below but not limited to:

- (a) Report directly to the Manager, or his designee, as to the operation of the Department;
- (b) Be The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Department;
- (c) Have executive management and administrative control of the Department, its personnel, properties, facilities and all other functions.
- (d) Be responsible for the hiring of all employees and subject to the approval of the City Manager, and the provision of law, to determine their qualifications and conditions for continued employment, assignment, promotion and transfer;

(e) Suspend, demote, discharge or take other disciplinary action against any member of the department for good and just cause according to law as provided for in the City Code and State Law;

(f) Have control of the executive management and administrative management of the Department by economical and efficient selection, utilization, deployment and disposition of all equipment and personnel, notwithstanding any other provisions of this Agreement;

(g) Delegate his authority at his discretion;

(h) Be responsible for the adoption and enforcement of policies, rules, regulations and other practices;

(i) Determine the table of organization of the Department;

(j) Be allowed the use of judgment and discretion in connection with the administration and operation of The Police Department, which shall be limited only by the terms of this Agreement and then only to the extent such terms hereof are in conformance with the Constitution and laws of New Jersey and the United States.

Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed to deny or restrict the City or Police Director of its rights, responsibilities and authority under federal, state, county or local laws or ordinances.

**ARTICLE II**  
**WORKWEEK**

1. The Police Director shall spend sufficient time at his job to insure the smooth and responsible operation of the Departments over which he has executive and administrative control.

2. The Director’s primary hours will be Monday thru Friday, 0900 to 1700 hours, but he may adjust them to meet the needs of the agency and the City.

3. Any hours the Director is required to work above Forty (40) hours per work, may be

adjusted later with the approval of the Manager or his designee. The Director may accrue a Flex Time bank of 80 hours to allow felexible hours/schedule regarding call outs/weekends., etc. This time shall accrue hour for hour and will not be subject to any payout upon termination of employment

4. The City shall provide the Police Director with a communication device such as an I-phone or similar device. The Police Director can use this device for personal business and shall have an expectation of privacy with this device. Otherwise, the City agrees to reimburse the Director for the use of a personal communication device. The City shall provide the Director a Vehicle

5. The Police Director shall be entitled to utilize personal days as provided for in the City Code and Personal Manual for Department Directors

**ARTICLE III**  
**VACATIONS**

- 1. The Police Director shall be entitled to twenty (25) days of vacation time annually.
- 2. The Police Director shall be entitled to schedule his vacation time, provided that the Police Director shall not take vacation leave unless [subordinates] are available to assume control of, and responsibility for, the operation of the Police Department. In addition, the Police Director shall not schedule his vacation time during any time period where planned events shall require the presence of the Police Director. The Police Director shall be required to report to the Manager or his designee, the dates, which the Police Director has selected for his vacation. Such information shall be provided to the Manager or his designee, in writing, at least one (1) week in advance of the beginning of the vacation period. If the vacation period selected by Police Director conflicts

with a planned activity that requires the presence of the Police Director, the Manager or his designee shall have the right to require the Police Director to select a different vacation period.

3. Any unused vacation time may be carried over for one consecutive year, with the approval of the Manager or his designee. Any unused and accrued vacation time shall be compensated for by the City at the current rate of pay when the Police Director becomes separated, either voluntarily or involuntarily, or retires from employment with the City.

**ARTICLE IV**  
**PERSONAL CAR**

1. The City agrees to supply the Police Director with a late model, unmarked automobile to be used for Department work and for his use. The City shall determine the make and model of the automobile.

2. The Police Director shall be permitted to use the car for personal use only within the State of New Jersey, unless written approval is granted by the City Manager. There shall be no limit on the use of the automobile for department work or anything associated with work, such as attending meetings, school outings, trips, conferences, and any other traveling needed to carry out the duties of the Police Director.

3. The City shall pay all expenses for the operation and upkeep of the automobile, such as but not limited to, car insurance, tires, gas, oil changes, cleaning, and any other necessary repairs.

4. The automobile shall not be used by anyone other than the Police Director, except that the Police Director may designate other members of the Department, as appropriate, to use the vehicle for a designated purpose. The Police Director shall have an expectation of privacy with the use of this vehicle.

**ARTICLE V**  
**SALARY**

1. The Police Director shall receive an annual base salary of:
  - A. \$150,000 effective upon his appointment as Police Director.
  - B. \$160,000 effective January 1, 2026
  - C. \$170,000 effective January 1, 2027.
  - D. The Director’s shall receive a negotiated pay increase on January 1<sup>st</sup>, for each successive year of this agreement.

**ARTICLE VI**  
**CONTINUATION OF BENEFITS NOT COVERED BY THIS AGREEMENT**

Other than as modified by this agreement The Police Director shall be entitled to any and all benefits provided to a Department Director. All employment conditions not covered by this agreement shall continue to be governed, controlled, and interpreted by reference to either the City Charter, Ordinances, or Rules and Regulations of the Department for the City and any present or past benefits which the Police Director customarily enjoys, but that have not been specifically included in this agreement, shall be continued.

**ARTICLE VII**  
**PERFORMANCE REVIEW**

The Parties agree that Hayes shall be subject to an annual performance review by the City Manager, with goals and objectives to be set on annual basis by the City Manager. The first performance review shall be held within three (3) months of Hayes’ commencement of employment with the City.

**ARTICLE VIII**  
**INDEMNIFICATION**

The City shall defend, save harmless and indemnify Hayes against any tort, professional liability claim(s) or demand(s) or other legal action(s), whether groundless or otherwise, arising out of an alleged act or omission that is within the scope of, and occurring

within the good faith performance of, Hayes’ duties as the Police Director for the City, to the extent permitted by applicable law. The City and/or its insurance carrier, in its/their sole discretion, may compromise and settle any such claim(s) or suit(s) and shall pay the amount of any settlement or judgment rendered herein.

**ARTICLE IX**  
**TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY THE CITY**

Hayes shall serve as an "at will" employee. The City Manager is the sole and exclusive appointing authority for the position of Police Director and shall be permitted to terminate this Agreement and the employment of Hayes, on thirty (30) calendar day notice, with or without cause in the City Manager’s sole discretion.

**ARTICLE X**  
**TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYEE**

Hayes may terminate this Agreement at his will, upon providing a minimum of thirty (30) calendar days' notice of his intention to resign from the position of Police Director. Should the Director terminate this Agreement pursuant to this Section, he shall assist the City in any transition work required to assist in finding a replacement Police Director.

**ARTICLE XI**  
**SEPARATION PROVISION**

1. The Director and the City agree that the following additional terms and conditions shall be applicable as of the date of the Director’s seperation:
2. The Director shall return all issued property, such as but not limited to equipment, phone, keys, access buttons and identification cards to the City.
3. The City agrees that subsequent to retirement or seperation, the Director will continue to have the same Professional Liability Insurance protection that existed during his active employment for defense and indemnification in the event that a claim is made as to acts or

omissions in his official position during active employment. Where the City deems it necessary for separate counsel to be appointed, the Director may select the attorney, of his choice, provided that the City shall not pay more than its policy provides for attorney fees.

4. The City agrees that if any of its agents requests that the Director, after his retirement or seperation, to attend hearings or hearing preparation or supply information on actions taken by him while he was employed by the City, will pay the Director his hourly rate during the year of retirement per hour for time actually spent on such matters. All transportation, housing and other incidentals shall be paid for by the City to attend hearings, depositions and any other matters that he would need to attend.

**ARTICLE XII**  
**FULLY BARGAINED PROVISIONS**

This agreement represents and incorporates the complete and final understanding and settlement by the parties on all bargainable issues, which were or could have been the subject of negotiations. During the term of this agreement, neither party will be required to negotiate with respect to any such matter, whether or not covered by this agreement, and whether or not within the knowledge or contemplation of either or both of the parties at the time they negotiated or signed this agreement.

**ARTICLE XIII**  
**DURATION AND RENEWAL**

**THIS AGREEMENT** shall be in full force and effect as of \_\_\_\_\_ and shall remain in effect to, and including, December 31, 2028. During negotiations for a successor agreement, this contract will remain in full force and effect until such time as it is re-negotiated by the parties.

BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER 2025-16**

**BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL EQUIPMENT, APPROPRIATING \$3,101,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,945,950 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE CITY OF ASBURY PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY**

BE IT ORDAINED by the CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASBURY PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the City of Asbury Park, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "City"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,101,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$155,050 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$2,945,950, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of (i) lighting improvements at Bond Street/Sunset Park; (ii) various improvements to the Department of Public Works; (iii) the acquisition of various equipment for the Department of Public Works; (iv) the acquisition of a club car, two (2) ford pick up trucks and a leaf vacuum trailer for the Department of Public Works; (v) the acquisition of self-contained breathing apparatus for the City's Fire Department; (vi) the acquisition of various equipment and computer upgrades/replacements for the City's IT Department; (vii) the acquisition of MDT's, E-Ticket Machines, MDT Cameras, PTZ Cameras and the installation of Camera Systems for the City's Police Department; and (viii) the acquisition of three (3) chevy tahoe's with outfitting and a GMC 15 passenger van for the City's Police Department, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the City Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the City.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$2,945,950, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$3,101,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The excess of the appropriation of \$3,101,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$155,050 down payment for said purposes.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the City (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the City may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 7.68089 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the City Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,945,950 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the City are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the City reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

Section 6. The capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the City Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the City for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and, unless paid from other sources, the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

**AMENDMENT TO THE MAIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, on November 12, 2008 the Mayor and City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2886 entitled "ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASBURY PARK, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ADOPTING THE MAIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT PLAN RELATING TO THE MAIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT AREA" (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq., the " Act") the Ordinance adopted a plan (the "Main Street Redevelopment Plan" or the "Plan") for the redevelopment of an area (the "Main Street Redevelopment Area" or the "Area"); and

WHEREAS, on November 12, 2014, the Mayor and City Council amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit microbreweries on Block 2702, Lot 7 in the Community Shopping Zone; and

WHEREAS, on February 28, 2018, the Mayor and City Council further amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit recording studios in the Community Shopping Zone permit valet parking in the Civic/South Gateway; and

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2018, the Mayor and City Council still further amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit banks and accessory ATM machines in the Sunset Park Zone; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2021, the Mayor and City Council further amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan in order to add Block 2503, Lots 2-5 under the City-wide Area in Need of Rehabilitation designation, and to permit Block 2503, Lots 1-5 to have a maximum height of five stories (60 feet) with an additional penthouse of 12 feet in height, and to require large expanses of blank walls to have murals as approved by the municipal public art commission; and WHEREAS, the Main Street Redevelopment Plan has led to an increase in public and private investment within the Area since its adoption, however, the Plan may benefit from amendments to remove barriers to further improvement and community benefit; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2024, the Mayor and City Council further amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit soup kitchens and food pantries Block 2805, Lot 17, and added related standards; and

WHEREAS, the Act sets forth the process by which amendments to any redevelopment

plan shall be considered and, if appropriate, adopted; and

WHEREAS, an existing adult day care, known as Jersey Shore Adult Day Health Care Center, located on Main Street, requested the City consider an amendment to the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit relocation of the use to 1105 Main Street (Block 2804, Lot 5.01) within the Main Street Redevelopment Area, Community Shopping Zone;

WHEREAS, the adult daycare is not a permitted use in the Community Shopping Zone of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan;

WHEREAS, in evaluating this request, the Mayor and Council considered the permitted uses in the existing Plan and the effect, if any, this amendment would have on the surrounding area as well as the community need for the services offered by the adult day care center;

WHEREAS, the Council finds that amendment to the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, Community Shopping Zone, is appropriate in order to permit the continuation of the use and provision of services to a vulnerable population of City and area residents, and that the location is appropriate given the existing conditions and surrounding land uses that include a variety of services as well as retail and restaurant uses;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Asbury Park as follows:

**SECTION 1.** (additions are shown as ***thus***; deletions are shown as ~~***thus***~~)

Page 39 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, the *Proposed Land Uses & Building Requirements By Character District* table, within the row setting forth the *Principal Uses* in the *Community Shopping Zone*, the following language shall be added:

**: adult day care, which may or may not be licensed by the NJ DOH, and associated services, including but not limited to social programming, medical services, transportation services and food preparation / services, is permitted on Block 2804, Lot 5.01.**

**SECTION 2.** (additions are shown as ***thus***; deletions are shown as ~~***thus***~~)

Page 40 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, the *Proposed Land Uses & Building Requirements By Character District* table, the following language shall be added below the table:

\* SPECIFIC ZONING AND DESIGN REGULATIONS FOR BLOCK 2804, Lot 5.01:

- One (1) off-street parking space shall be reserved for a vehicle providing transportation services to attendees of an adult day care located on the property. When not in use by transportation services, the parking space may be used for loading and deliveries. The reserved parking space may be included in those that satisfy the minimum parking standards stated in the *Parking Standards* table herein.

**SECTION 3.** (additions are shown as ***thus***; deletions are shown as **~~*thus*~~**)

Page 43 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, within the *Parking Standards* table, within the *Commercial Uses* row, the following shall be added:

<b><u>Adult day care</u></b>	<b><u>Per 900 sf</u></b>	<b><u>1</u></b>	<b><u>N/A</u></b>

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Asbury Park authorized the Planning Board by Resolution Number 2025-210, to undertake a review of proposed amendments to the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, hereinafter referred to as the MSRP or Plan, that will permit the premises located on Block 2804, Lot 5.01 a/k/a 1105 Main Street to be used as an adult daycare center which is not presently permitted within the Plan (this specific location is located in the Community Shopping Zone) pursuant to the requirements set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7e. The details of the proposed Ordinance amendments are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, said statute requires that the Planning Board prepare and transmit a report back to the Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, said statute further requires that the report of the Planning Board include an identification of any provision or provisions set forth in the proposed amendments to the MSRP that are inconsistent with the City Master Plan and contain recommendations concerning those inconsistencies and any other matters as the Board deems appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Board conducted a public hearing on May 5, 2025, on the proposed amendments, at which hearing the amendments were presented on behalf of the Governing Body of the City of Asbury Park by Board Planner, Donna Miller; and

WHEREAS, members of the public were afforded the opportunity to testify at the meeting on the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the proposed amendments are consistent with the majority of the elements of the City Master Plan and the MSRP, with a minor inconsistency with the Land Use Plan element of the Master Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Planning Board of the City of Asbury Park that it hereby recommends the adoption of the proposed amendments with the following recommendations being incorporated therein and the foregoing finding that the proposed amendments are consistent with the majority of the City Master Plan and the goals and objectives of the MSRP; and

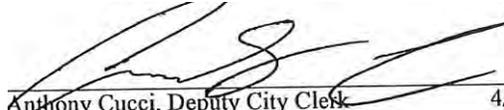

**WHEREAS**, on July 17, 2024, the Mayor and City Council further amended the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit soup kitchens and food pantries Block 2805, Lot 17, and added related standards; and

**WHEREAS**, the Act sets forth the process by which amendments to any redevelopment plan shall be considered and, if appropriate, adopted; and

**WHEREAS**, an existing adult day care, known as Jersey Shore Adult Day Health Care Center, located on Main Street, requested the City consider an amendment to the Main Street Redevelopment Plan to permit relocation of the use to 1105 Main Street (Block 2804, Lot 5.01) within the Community Shopping Zone of the Main Street Redevelopment Area;

**WHEREAS**, the adult daycare is not a permitted use in the Community Shopping Zone of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the City of Asbury Park as follows:

**SECTION 1.** (additions are shown as *thus*; deletions are shown as #ms)

Page 39 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, the *Proposed Land Uses & Building Requirements By Character District* table, within the row setting forth the *Principal Uses* in the *Community Shopping Zone*, the following language shall be added:

*: adult day care, which may or may not be licensed by the NJ DOH, and associated services, including but not limited to social programming, medical services, transportation services and food preparation /services, is permitted on Block 2804, Lot 5.01.*

**SECTION 2.** (additions are shown as *thus*; deletions are shown as #His)

Page 40 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, the *Proposed Land Uses & Building Requirements By Character District* table, the following language shall be added below the table:

- \* SPECIFIC ZONING AND DESIGN REGULATIONS FOR BLOCK 2804, Lot 5.01:
  - One (1) off-street parking space shall be reserved for each vehicle providing transportation services to attendees of an adult day care located on the property. The pick-up/drop-off of attendees shall occur in the parking space(s) reserved for this purpose. When not in use by transportation services, the parking space(s) may be used for loading and deliveries. The reserved parking space(s) may be included in those that satisfy the minimum parking standards stated in the *Parking Standards* table herein.

**SECTION 3.** (additions are shown as *thus:* deletions are shown as **#ws**)

Page 43 of the Main Street Redevelopment Plan, within the *Parking Standards* table, within the

*Commercial Uses* row, the following shall be added:

**BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TRAIN  
STATION CANOPIES, APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000  
THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF  
\$704,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF  
THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE  
CITY OF ASBURY PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF  
MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY**

BE IT ORDAINED by the CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASBURY PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the City of Asbury Park, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "City"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated \$1,000,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including \$296,000 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) FY2025 Transit Village Program. No down payment is required or appropriated herein, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11c of the Local Bond Law.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of a down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$704,000, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized to be undertaken consist of transportation center canopy repairs, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or apparent thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the City's Chief Financial Officer, as finally approved by the governing body of the City.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$704,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$1,000,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The excess of the appropriation of \$1,000,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$296,000 grant funds expected to be received from the NJDOT.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the City (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the City may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is twenty (20) years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the City Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$704,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$140,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the City are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the City reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

Section 6. The capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the City Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the City for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and, unless paid from other sources, the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
